## **English/Communication:**

As readers we will be reading stories and information texts about the stone age.

As writers we will use The Write Stuff approach to develop effective sentences for our adventure story and holiday brochure. We will hold experience days, to work collaboratively to gather vocabulary and ideas for use in our writing. We will be developing our understanding of nouns, adjectives, verbs, noun phrases, time adverbials, onomatopoeia, similes, alliteration and synonyms. We will be writing using full stops, capital letters, question marks, commas and exclamation marks. We will begin to use inverted commas to demarcate speech. We will use a narrative map and the "Writing Rainbow" to create our own independent writing.

### Maths:

This half-term will continue to use the NCETM curriculum prioritisation framework. We will be able to recognise, name and represent three digit numbers. We will be adding and subtracting multiples of 10 and 100. Using known facts, we will solve problems. We will be also be working on our recall of the x5 and x10 tables and x2 tables.

#### Science:

As geologists we will continue our study of rocks, fossils and soils. We will learn how soils are made from rock and organic matter. We will compare and separate soils. We will endeavour to make our own edible soil layers.

### RE:

In RE we will be exploring the question: 'What are the deeper meanings of festivals?" We will identify the main beliefs in religious festivals and make links between the beliefs and the stories recalled at these festivals. We will describe how believers celebrate festivals in different ways. We will raise questions and suggest answers about what is worth celebrating and remembering in religious communities and their own lives.

### PE:

We will be working with Dan, our rugby coach from Newcastle Falcons to develop our game skills.
