
Year group: 1



Religious Education - Creation

In our RE lessons we will continue to explore and discuss Creation. We will consolidate our knowledge of each day of Creation, the things that were made and the order they were made in. We will discuss questions we still have on Creation and endeavour to find the answers.

French:

We will begin French this half-term. We will learn numbers to 10 using songs and games to help us. We will learn the colours of the rainbow as well as body parts and simple greeting. Finally, we will celebrate all things French on our very own French day!

PSHE:

In PSHE we will be looking at growing and changing as we think about moving to Year 2. We will be thinking about our bodies and the processes that our internal body parts help us do. We will discuss and explore the differences between now and when children were just a baby.

Physical Education:

In our PE lessons we will be learning how to do a series of gymnastic skills such as travelling on benches, rolling on mats and using larger apparatus. We will be creating our own sequences and performing them to our peers.

Mathematics:

In Mathematics we will start to look at multiplication and division. We will explore the term 'equal' and arrange objects into equal rows and groups. We will start to look at one step word problems and how to solve them using our knowledge of equal groups. We will then learn to group and share equally to explore division using concrete apparatus and pictorial representation.

Science: Animals

In our science lessons we will be learning to name sort and classify animals into their groups. We will know distinctive features of animals in the bird, fish, reptile, amphibian and mammal group. We will also be looking at the structure of animals and their diet. We will be able to sort and classify animals into omnivores, carnivores and herbivores.

Geography

In our Geography lessons we will be learning to identify, name and locate the four countries and capital cities in the United Kingdom. We will be continuing our work on compass direction and using vocabulary such as North, South, East and West to describe locations in relation to each other and where they are on the map.
