This term we will be exploring geometry, including angles and co-ordinates. We will also continue with decimal fractions.

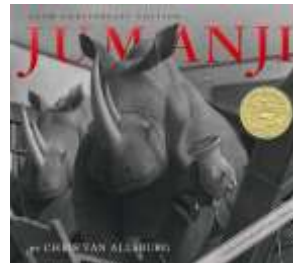
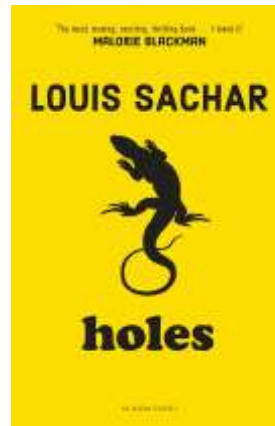
RE: How does religion help people live through good and bad times?
