Year group: 1

Time Allocation: 1/2 term

English:

As communicators we will be discussing the vocabulary used to describe jungle settings. We will be hot seating characters to help us predict how they will react in a situation. We will be giving clues and riddles about characters to guess who they are. We will discuss the organisation of instructional texts. As readers we will be listening to and discussing stories and poems with a jungle theme. We will be identifying what senses have been used to describe the setting. We will be predicting what might happen next and making inferences on the basis of what is being said and done. As writers we will use speech bubbles to show how characters are feeling within the stories we share. We will also create our own jungle story using our senses to describe the setting. We will write instructions to explain how to make a puppet and use vocabulary associated with our materials topic to create our own marvellous mixture.

Mathematics:

As mathematicians, we will learn to count to 20. We will develop our understanding of 10 and use the 10 and a bit structure to develop our understanding of numbers within 20. We will use concrete apparatus to draw attention to the fact that two tens are equivalent to 20. We will find one more and one less of any number within 20 and use a number line to 20. We will compare and order numbers to 20. We will add and subtract within 20. We will use number bonds, doubles and near doubles to add. We will subtract by counting back and finding the difference. We will solve missing number problems.

Science: Plants:

As scientists, we will be identifying and describing the different parts of plants. We will label different parts of plants. We will watch as our plants grow in the classroom and discuss what they need to grow well. We will record the height of the plants using cubes and we will record our observations of the changes that happen.

Seasonal changes: We will continue to observe changes across the seasons. We will observe and describe weather associated with the season and how day length varies.

Computing: Creating Media-Digital Painting

We will continue to practise logging on and learn how to use the keyboard. We will learn how to use computers safely and responsibly. We will be learning how to paint using the computer using paint tools. We will draw lines, make shapes, use dots and change dot and brush sizes to create work in the style of an artist.

Religious Education: Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?

In our RE lessons, we will be begin to find out about the religion of Islam. We will find out about the Shahadah and how this is the most important belief for Muslims. We will explore some of the 99 names used for Allah. We will listen to some stories about the Prophet Muhammad and consider what lessons they teach Muslims. We will explore the story of the Night of Power and learn about how, when and where Muslims read the Qur'an.




Geography: How does the weather affect our lives?
