Science Week

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

Dear Parent/Carer,

As you will be aware, NHS Test and Trace announced last week, that all adults in households with school age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing.

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are different ways for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- an employer if they offer testing to employees
- Community Testing via a symptom free testing site
- by collecting a home test kit from a Collection Point
- by ordering a home test kit online

You can find out more about locations of sites and collection points in Northumberland via Northumberland County Council's website HERE (https://nland.uk/rapidtest).

Please be aware some of the collection points may change over the coming weeks as control of the local testing programme is transferred to the local authority from central government. All information will be kept up to date on the county council website. We appreciate your patience and cooperation at this time.

You will need to report your test result even it is negative. You will need to do this via gov.uk/report-covid19-result

If you have any queries about the tests, please call 119.

Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Your child will not be asked to take a test as part of this programme of testing. However, should they show symptoms of coronavirus it is advised you:

- tell the school
- self-isolate immediately
- get a PCR test to confirm the result
- follow the stay at home guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.
