English/Communication:

Using Flotsam by David Wiesner and Mr Penguin and the Lost Treasure by Alex T. Smith, we will write setting descriptions, mystery sequels, postcards, non-chronological reports and message in a bottle letters. We will build on our understanding of nouns, adjectives, verbs, noun phrases, similes, alliteration, personification, repetition for effect and synonyms. We will use full stops, capital letters, question marks, commas, exclamation marks and inverted commas for speech. In SPAG, we will explore adverbs and prepositions to show how, when and where.

Maths:

In maths we will be continuing our work on measurement, and working on fractions by finding and recognising unit fractions. We will learn to represent, find and recognise non-unit fractions as well as use our knowledge to solve fraction related problems. We will also need to be practising and consolidating our times tables. We will learn how to recognise and find right angles.

Science: Light

We will recognise that we need light to see things and that dark is the absence of light. We will notice that light is reflected from surfaces. We will recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect our eyes. We will recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object. We will look for patterns in the way that the size of shadows change.


RE:
