


Summer 1 Curriculum Overview – Celebrating Self

<p>COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding. • Answer how and why questions • Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, nonfiction, rhymes and poems when appropriate. <p>Vocabulary: how? What if? because,</p>	<p>PERSONAL SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Try new activities and say why they like some more than others • Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate. • Be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge. <p>Vocabulary: fasten, zip, side, up, down, back, forward, listen, challenge, calm, understand.</p>	<p>PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others. • Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing. • Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing. • Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases. • Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery. <p>Vocabulary: carefully, slowly, balance, travel, hopping, skipping, grip, finger, thumb, tight.</p>
